Presídent's Message

Growing your Group - One Person at a Time

Dear LWML Sisters in Christ.

In the past 42 years that I have been an active Lutheran Woman in Mission I have heard, "How do we get more younger women involved in LWML?" more times than I can count. But maybe we need to ask, "How can we get more women involved?"

In the Spring 2025 "Mammoth Tales Ice Age Alliance" publication, I read an article about a volunteer for their organization. When asked why she volunteers, she said, "It has given me purpose and a community of friends." As Lutheran Women in Mission, we can say the same thing: "Serving has given me purpose and a community of friends," but more importantly, we grow closer to our Savior!

Two years ago, we were asked to contemplate, "What's Your Why?" Can you put into words why being a Lutheran Woman in Mission is important to you? Can you share your passion for God's Word, mission support, and Christian fellowship with others?

Renewal Chairman, Diane Meyer, shares "We need to build relationships!" We need to talk to other women in our churches and build a relationship with them prior to inviting them to join in our group or zone activities. This relationship building thing takes time, commitment and works best one on one. Once you've gotten to know a person, then consider asking them to attend a group Bible study or service project event.

Humm! Did you catch what to invite them to? Do not invite them to a 'meeting' if you want them to return. Invite them to a planned event:

a Bible Study, Quilt Tying, School Backpack packing, Health Kit assembling; something with a purpose and value, and a positive use of time. Meetings can be handled by a few to plan the 'doings' of a group. Fellowship during an event builds relationships! (Beware: New group members come with new ideas. Give new ideas an opportunity to develop.)

"The purpose of the LWML SWD is to assist each woman in the congregations of our district in affirming her relationship with the Triune God so that she is enabled to use her Spirit-endowed gifts in reaching out with Christ's love to all the people of her church, neighborhood, and the world."

When you build personal relationships as sisters in Christ and a community of friends, recognize and affirm the service of each woman in your congregation, plan group activities with a purpose and value, and continue sharing the love of Christ, your group will grow spiritually and in membership. Dear Sisters in Christ,

Alleluia! Christ is risen!

He is risen indeed! Alleluia!

You may have realized that Lent makes us ponder repentance, and Easter gives us a joyous feast of the gifts promised by Jesus. Yet, why do we have extra Divine Services? Why do we spend more time at church? Why do we have longer services?

If your pastor has done his job, then you weren't allowed to dwell in the apathy and stupor of sinful negligence. The preaching of the Law should have struck you to the heart, and the Gospel showed you the death that we have been saved from! You and I need the yearly reminder that we have been shaken out of our winter holes like a groundhog traumatized by his shadow.

Maybe you don't think you are as cowardly as a groundhog surrounded by men dressed as pilgrims on a cloudy day, but you are still prone to those long sleeps. Now, I am not accusing you of sleeping in physically. Yet we do become atrociously lethargic during the winter months, simply desiring to make it through the snow and ice of winter. Then summer hits and you are enlivened! Like a bear seeing the spring sun and thrilled to leave its cave!

Now is the time for trips, beaches, family grill outs, fireworks, boat rides on the lake, fishing, and the list could go on. There is so much to do! And now we have celebrated Easter, we proclaimed that Christ is risen! We convince ourselves that church takes the backseat. It fits in where our weekends have no other obligations, trips, or adventures. Beloved in the Lord, we don't know the day or the hour of Jesus' return. Nor do we know the day that will be our death. The check was Brookfield personally presented at Lutheran Church to the CEO of this organization, Rev. Chris Singer. The Comfort Dogs staff and handlers were very excited and appreciative of the size of the check and kept thanking me. I always responded that this check was made possible from many pennies, nickels and dimes contributed from LWML SWD ladies.

All seven Wisconsin Comfort Dogs were present as well as most of their handler teams and it was quite a large group of people. There were also several of our LWML SWD ladies in attendance. The dogs were very well-behaved, although the picture taking was not their thing!

The \$21,000 check will be used to supplement travel expenses when the Above are some of our SWD ladies with dogs are deployed to disasters and the dogs, LCC staff and handler teams tragedies. Their presence is a bridge for compassionate ministry and opening door's for conversations' about faith and the healing power of Jesus Christ for those who are hurting. Lutheran Church Charities never charges those who are served so the dogs' host church/school/ ministry are always working to raise money. The dogs are only deployed when and where they are invited, mostly on short notice, anywhere in the United States. This demand has increased throughout our country. These dogs also serve their respective communities at nursing homes, schools and hospitals as well as being major players in multiple education programs Concordia at University Wisconsin.

2023–2025 Mission Grant 4 - FORTIFYING FAITH IN THOSE WITH VISION IMPAIRMENT | Lutheran Braille Workers - \$100,000 PAID IN FULL!

Lutheran Braille Workers (LBW) has the opportunity to reach individuals with visual impairment who live in spiritual darkness with the hope and salvation of Jesus Christ. There are millions of people around the world who are blind or visually impaired. They seek to strengthen their Christian faith while coping with isolation and dealing with physical, mental, and spiritual struggles. They often find it difficult to access Scripture-based reading materials.

This grant will provide LBW the opportunity to produce and add to their library 50 to 100 Scripture-based topical materials in Braille and specialized large print to help meet the spiritual and emotional needs of people who are visually impaired. Because LBW works with every Christian denomination, these materials would be available for outreach and evangelism at no cost to those who are blind or visually impaired regardless of faith or belief.

LWML Convention Travel Update

Registration for the Omaha bound Sonshine Travelers Motorcoach began at the BOD meeting on February 8, 2025, and by the end of February every seat on the motorcoach was filled. Delegates who wanted seats, Young Women's Reps, and those on the BOD were given priority. The remainder of the seats were filled by general registrants.

There is a waiting list of people for seats on the motorcoach should there be a cancellation due to illness or other uncontrollable situations. If you wish to be on that list, contact me immediately at the email address shown below.

At one point, I had 20 people on that waiting list, and so I was looking for seats on other district motorcoaches. One of the deterrents for people riding on other district motorcoaches was that the price was more than 50% higher than for our South Wisconsin District motorcoach. We are very blessed that Pastor Meier with the Sonshine Travelers Motorcoach is so willing to give us such a bargain for this travel. This is not only a savings for those on the motorcoach, but it is a savings to the LWML SWD administrative fund as this low travel cost is what is paid from the administrative fund for all LWML SWD delegates to the convention. Thank God for Pastor Meier and the Sonshine Travelers.

After researching having a second motorcoach from our district, the price of that, too, would have been nearly \$400 per person, and we did not appear to be able to fill another motorcoach, so in addition to the waiting list, I have been connecting people with other people driving in their personal vehicles. If you are driving to Omaha and you have additional space in your vehicle or if you are in need of a ride, please email me at the address below. If you are contacting me for assistance with ride sharing, please provide the city in which you live and a cellphone number, so I can start matching you.

The Sonshine Travelers Motorcoach will be leaving early in the morning on Wednesday, June 25, from Peace Lutheran Church in Beaver Dam and St. Paul's Lutheran Church in Janesville. More details will be provided to those riding on the Sonshine Travelers Motorcoach, and those riders are welcome to contact me with any questions. I am excited about the convention in two months! Happy spring, ladies! It's time to go on a leisurely walk, enjoy the sunshine, or start prepping the flower garden for the lovely blooms to arrive! My computer certainly is smiling with the generosity of my fellow LWML sisters! As of March 31, our mite current total for the biennium is \$121,634.74 (\$96,068.66 for the South Wisconsin District and \$25,566.08 for the National LWML). For clarification purposes, our SWD mite total includes, not only for mites collected, but contributions from endowment fund interest, bank interest, and the past biennium mite overage of \$16,548.28. We will need to collect approximately \$8,197 monthly for the balance of the biennium to obtain our goal of \$220,000.



The mission grant amount voted on at convention was \$220,000 with \$165,000 for SWD grants and \$55,000 for LWML grants. The excess from the 2022-2024 biennium of \$16,548.28 was added to the SWD amount per the majority vote of the delegates for a final total for SWD mission grants of \$181,548.28. After delegate voting, the first 7 grants above will be fully funded and the 8th one will be partially funded, as noted.
