I thank God for each of you as you serve Him wherever you are and with the gifts He has graciously given you. God's peace and joy be with you always.



CONVENTION RULES

1. The voting body consists of two accredited delegates from each society, the voting members of the Board of Directors (elected officers, zone presidents and chairmen of standing committees) and past SWD Presidents who are currently LWML SWD members. (Article V, Section B.3) Pastoral Counselors are Advisory Members. (Article XII, B)

2. A majority of the registered voting body shall constitute a quorum.

3. Only those delegates who have registered with the Registration Committee and are given the identifying badge may vote. Delegates will sit in the section reserved for voting members and wear their badges for the day. (An alternate may vote in the absence of the delegate and will sit in the section reserved for the voting body when acting as a delegate.)

4. Only members of the voting body have the right to speak and vote (Article V, Section B-3).

5. Any voting member wishing the floor shall give her name, zone, and church or office in order to be recognized.

6. Discussion is limited to fifteen (15) minutes on any question and to two (2) minutes for each speaker. No one may speak more than twice on the same subject without the consent of the voting body, the second opportunity being granted only after every other delegate desiring the floor for the first time has spoken.

7. A motion must be presented to the President in writing, signed by the maker, if so requested by the President.

8. The Chair shall be empowered to appoint such committees as shall be necessary for the conduct of the convention.

9. The Chair shall be empowered to appoint a Minutes Review Committee to approve the minutes of the convention after the close of the session.

10. All announcements shall be handed to a page or usher who will deliver them to the Chair.

11. The sale of items at convention is limited to the printed or recorded publications of the guest speaker's related topic, as well as Christian Life products and Concordia Publishing House items. Non-LCMS speaker's items need EC approval six (6) months in advance of the event. (Adopted by Board of Directors, September, 2005.)

12. Cell phones, pagers and other electronic devices must be turned to "off" or "vibrate" during convention sessions.

13. These rules may be suspended by a two-thirds(2/3) vote of the voting body.

MISSION GRANT PROPOSALS

1. IN SCHOOL COUNSELING FOR MENTAL HEALTH OF STUDENTS - LCFS \$10,000

- **PURPOSE:** To improve the mental health in youth.
- WHEREAS, Christ in His Holy Word has charged Lutheran Counseling & Family Services of Wisconsin (LCFS) to help and care for all those who seek care for mental health counseling, especially children who are struggling in school or at home with a behavioral, emotional or mental health issue; and
- WHEREAS, A young soul that is healthy in body and spirit must also be healthy in mind to best live a fulfilling, productive and peaceful life; and
- WHEREAS, schools and families of elementary aged children in social economically challenged neighborhoods o ten cannot financially afford professional counseling for children in crisis, LCFS will provide these services at no cost to the schools and help to cover fee payments for families so that each child in need of mental health counseling receives the care he or she needs; and
- WHEREAS, LCFS has licensed counselors trained in clinical child psychology, family dynamics and trauma recovery who deliver Christian-based counseling with a focus on understanding how God's love can help put daily activities, problems and challenges into perspective, with early intervention these children will overcome the challenges they face

MISSION GRANT PROPOSALS

2. AFRICAN IMMIGRANT MINISTRY MINIBUS- International Lutheran Church of Zion \$30,000

PURPOSE: To provide transportation for new immigrants to travel to worship and other church events.

WHEREAS,	in recent years the LCMS has been blessed with a Congolese congregation in Milwaukee and a new mission in Appleton, each with over 100 members. These ministries are led by Pastor Kasongo Gui Kabeo of the International Lutheran Church of Zion in Milwaukee, and
WHEREAS,	new Congolese immigrants continue to arrive in Wisconsin, especially in the Fox Valley, and
WHEREAS,	our ministries in Milwaukee and Appleton are currently renting a 12 passenger van each week at a great cost to transport new members from Oshkosh to services in Appleton, therefore be it
RESOLVED,	that the ladies of the South Wisconsin District LWML partner with our brothers and sisters in Christ at the International Lutheran Church of Zion in Milwaukee with a grant of \$30,000 for the purchase of a 12-passenger minibus to transport new immigrant members from Oshkosh to worship and other events, and be it further
RESOLVED,	That we pray that God will establish the work of our hands (Psalm 90:17) as many within our South Wisconsin District work to establish a new Congolese ministry in the City of Oshkosh.

3. SOS CENTER DESIGNED FOR SUCCESS - SOS CENTER, MILWAUKEE \$20,000

PURPOSE:	To provide intentional educational enrichment in a safe Christian environment.
WHEREAS <i>,</i>	The SOS Center Inc. provides a safe, caring, Christian environment for Milwaukee area children and families,
WHEREAS,	Inner city youth will be provided with opportunities to learn and improve their educational skills, life skills and self-care, while learning about the Gospel of Christ, and
WHEREAS,	with God's love and guidance these youth can be guided to make better choices where they can improve their education, finish school, and make better life choices, and,
WHEREAS,	inner-city Milwaukee youth need enriching educational and Christian activities offering opportunities and experiences in a safe, positive environment
RESOLVED,	That the SWD LWML in convention vote the sum of \$20,000 to help fund the cost for one year of grief support, Irreplaceable Gems and additional activities for children and youth at SOS Center to ensure their continued learning, life skills development and growth in Christ's word.

4. WHO IS MY NEIGHBOR? BIBLE BOOKS FOR IMMIGRANT OUTREACH \$12,500

PURPOSE: To translate and publish Lutheran books in the languages of immigrants and refugees, and to give them away free of charge to those who need them. WHEREAS, Jesus Christ implores us to care for strangers ("...I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me drink, I was a stranger and you welcomed me..." Matt 25:35); and WHEREAS. South Wisconsin's cities are experiencing a sharp increase in the number of immigrants and refugees from other countries, to where the foreign-born now compromise 5 percent of Wisconsin's total population; and many of the immigrants from places like China and Iran have never WHEREAS, heard the Gospel of Jesus Christ until it's shared with them at churches like Zion Lutheran in Oshkosh, WI and St. John's Lutheran in Portage, WI or at campus ministries like the International Friendship Center at the Madison campus of the University of Wisconsin; and these ministries and others from across the United States have WHEREAS. expressed a deep need for Lutheran books, printed in the languages of the people God has placed on their doorsteps, to help overcome this barrier; and WHEREAS, the Lutheran Heritage Foundation, an RSO of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod, has for nearly 30 years vigorously fulfilled its mission of translating and publishing Lutheran books, such as Luther's Small Catechism and A Child's Garden of Bible Stories into the languages of the world; therefore be it that the LWML South Wisconsin District in convention vote the sum **RESOLVED**, of \$12,500 for the Lutheran Heritage Foundation to publish and distribute at least 2,500 Lutheran Books for Immigrants, giving South Wisconsin's church leaders and missionaries the tools they need to share the Good News of Jesus Christ with the immigrants in their neighborhoods.

WHEREAS,	the 2019 Synodical Convention passed three resolutions encouraging financial support for future church workers: Resolution 4-03A (To Commend to Synod Priorities for Mission and Ministry Emphasis for the 2019-2022 Triennium), Resolution 12-01A (To Commend and Give Thanks for our Lutheran Early Childhood Centers, Elementary Schools, and High Schools), Resolution 12-02A (To Exhort the Congregations of the LCMS to Actively Encourage Future Lutheran School Teachers); and
WHEREAS,	the 2018 South Wisconsin District Convention passed Resolution 3-03 (To Exhort the Congregations of the South Wisconsin District to Actively Encourage Future Lutheran School Teachers); and

WHEREAS,	the role of the LCMS Deaconess is to sit alongside female inmates in need of comfort, spiritual support, forgiveness. LUTHERAN WOMEN'S MISSIONARY LEAGUE SOUTH WISCONSIN DISTRICT **BYLAWS**

ARTICLE I – NAME

The name of this organization shall be the Lutheran Women's Missionary League, South Wisconsin District (hereinafter referred to as LWML SWD), a subordinate organization of the Lutheran Women's Missionary League. The Lutheran Women's Missionary League (hereinafter referred to as LWML) is an integrated auxiliary of The Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod (hereinafter referred to as LCMS).

Rationale: Per LCMS, the official way to list this is with an 'em' dash with no spaces between the h and the M.

ARTICLE II – OBJECT

The object of this organization shall be:

- To develop and maintain a greater mission consciousness among the women of the A. LWML SWD through MISSION EDUCATION, MISSION INSPIRATION, and **MISSION SERVICE.**
- B. To gather funds for the support of mission grants, which have been approved by the LWML SWD Board of Directors (hereinafter referred to as BOD) and the SWD LCMS District Mission Executive or LCMS National and International Missions especially those for which no adequate provision has been made in LCMS budgets.

Rationale: Voting and change of LCMS office names are covered in Article XVII.

ARTICLE III – MEMBERS

- A woman who is a communicant member of an LCMS congregation shall be eligible for A. membership.
- Β. Women's organizations of the LCMS, whether already existing or specifically organized for the purpose of affiliation with the LWML SWD, shall be eligible for membership as societies/groups.

Rationale: The use of group/groups may be used more. These changes will occur throughout the document.

Women's societies/groups within the LCMS congregations, on a campus, in a resident C. home, or in another setting shall be the unit of membership. Multiple societies/groups in a single setting shall be considered one (1) unit when determining representation for LWML conventions. This does not pertain to district convention representation.

Rationale: For clarification purposes.

- D. Women who hold membership in an LCMS congregation may form a society/group in a setting other than a congregation, a campus, or a resident home, upon approval of the LWML SWD Executive Committee (hereinafter referred to as EC). Such societies/groups shall be assigned to a zone by the EC.
- E. Individual membership is available to a woman who is a communicant member of an LCMS congregation with or without a society/group affiliated with the LWML. Application shall be made to the LWML SWD Corresponding Secretary. Individual membership is not considered a society/group or a unit. An individual member may hold district office or hold zone office when permitted by zone bylaws. A local society/group or unit may choose an individual member to represent them at LWML SWD conventions as designated for all other members in the zone bylaws.

ARTICLE IV – DISTRICT ORGANIZATION

A. Society/Group Organization

Every affiliated society/group is encouraged to hold meetings at least quarterly and be devoted to:

- 1. Christ-centered programs with emphasis on missions;
- 2. the receiving of Mite Box offerings;
- 3. the Gospel Ooutreach work of the LWML.

Rationale: This will give further clarification of the work.

Zone Organization

- 1. Zones shall promote the object of the LWML: MISSION EDUCATION, MISSION INSPIRATION, and MISSION SERVICE;
- 2. Zones shall provide an opportunity for spiritual development and Christian fellowship through zone rallies and may offer workshops and/or prayer services;
- 3. Zones of the LWML SWD shall be defined by the LWML SWD BOD.

District Tax-exempt Status

The LWML SWD, in order to remain a qualified tax-exempt organization, shall:

- 1. maintain the sales tax-exempt number assigned by the State of Wisconsin found in the LWML SWD *General Guidelines*, Section I,C page 4, C;
- maintain the Federal Employer Identification Number assigned by the United States Internal Revenue Service- found in the (LWML SWD *General Guidelines*, Section I, D page 4 D).

Rationale: To clarify which guidelines this information comes from.

ARTICLE V – CONVENTIONS AND REPRESENTATION

- A. The LWML SWD Convention (hereinafter referred to as the District Convention) shall meet biennially, in the even-numbered years. The BOD shall arrange for the District Conventions through the establishment of a convention committee.
- B. District Conventions

The District Convention shall be a delegate body organized in the following manner:

- 1. Each society/group affiliated with the LWML SWD shall choose two (2) delegates to represent them at convention and two (2) alternate delegates who will represent the society/group if the delegates are unable to attend. Societies/Groups are also encouraged to send one (1) or two (2) Young Woman Representatives;
- 2. Delegates shall preferably be society/group officers or well-informed members;
- 3. Members of the convention who have a voice and vote therein shall be:
 - a. two (2) certified delegates representing each affiliated society/group in the LWML SWD;
 - b. voting members of the BOD;
 - c. past LWML SWD presidents who are currently LWML SWD members.
- 4. Names of delegates and alternates and other required information shall be sent to the Convention Registrar before the announced deadline.

C. LWML Conventions

- The LWML SWD shall be represented at the LWML Convention in the following manner:
 - 1. One (1) certified delegate from each zone having ten (10) or fewer units and one (1) certified delegate for each additional ten (10) units or major fraction thereof, as of January 1 preceding the convention;
 - and zone president shall be that delegate if possible
 - a. each zone president shall be that delegate, if possible;
 - b. each delegate shall have an alternate to the convention;
 - c. the alternate shall be from the slate of other zone officers or be chosen by the zone president with the approval of that zone's BOD.

2. The LWML SWD President (hereinafter referred to as President) attends in her capacity as a member of the BOD Presidents Assembly. In the event the President cannot attend, she may send as her substitute an elected District officer who shall have voice, but no and vote;

Rationale: To conform to LWML Bylaw changes in 2019 and 2021.

3. One (1) LWML SWD Pastoral Counselor (hereinafter referred to as Pastoral Counselor) serves in an advisory capacity, selected on a rotating basis. (See Article, XII, B)

ARTICLE VI – ELECTED OFFICERS

- The officers of the LWML SWD shall be President, Vice President of Organizational Α. Resources, Vice President of Gospel Outreach and Christian Life, Vice President of Special Focus Ministries and Mission Grants, Vice President of Communication, Recording Secretary, Corresponding Secretary, Financial Secretary, and Treasurer.
- Β. All officers shall hold office for four (4) years or until their successors are elected. No officer shall be eligible for consecutive re-election to the same office.
- C. The President, Vice President of Special Focus Ministries and Mission Grants, Vice President of Communications, Corresponding Secretary and Treasurer shall be elected at one District Convention. The Vice President of Organizational Resources, Vice President of Gospel Outreach and Christian Life, Recording Secretary, and Financial Secretary shall be elected at the next District Convention.

Rationale: To conform to the rest of the document.

ARTICLE VII – NOMINATION AND ELECTION OF OFFICERS

- The Nominating Committee shall be composed of zone presidents, rotating through the A. zones as stipulated in the *General Guidelines*. In her absence, a zone president may send an alternate from her zone, preferably another zone officer.
- B. Candidates for LWML SWD office shall:
 - 1. be members of LWML SWD;
 - 2. have served as an LWML zone officer, zone standing committee chairman, or as a BOD member.
- C. The Nominating Committee shall:
 - 1. obtain potential candidates for officers and Pastoral Counselors at least seven (7) months prior to the District convention;
 - 2. obtain at least three (3) nominations for Pastoral Counselor and secure approval of nominees from the LCMS SWD president;
 - 3. obtain written consent of the potential candidates to serve if elected;
 - 4. select two (2) candidates for each office.
- D. Additional nominations may be made from the floor, provided the person has given written consent and meets the qualifications for office. Floor nominations for Pastoral Counselor must have prior written approval from the candidate and the LCMS District President.
- E. All elections shall be by printed ballot. The candidate receiving the majority of votes for each office shall be declared elected. If there are three (3) or more candidates for the same office the one (1) receiving the fewest number of votes shall be removed from each successive ballot. If elections cannot be held in person, see Article XIX, B, for procedure.

Rationale: To provide alternative voting procedure when needed in an emergency.

F. Officers shall assume their duties at the close of the District Convention. Retiring officers shall transfer to their respective successor all materials pertaining to the office within thirty (30) days after the close of the fiscal year.

ARTICLE VIII – DUTIES OF OFFICERS

The President shall:

- 1. preside at the District Convention and at all meetings of the EC and BOD;
- 2. be responsible for the implementation of all LWML SWD resolutions;
- appoint standing committees and appointed personnel with the approval of the EC, for a period of two (2) years, unless otherwise indicated in the LWML SWD Bylaws;
- 4. appoint task force chairmen as needed, with approval of the EC;
- 5. be the voting representative of the LWML SWD at LWML Board of Directors' Presidents Assembly meetings, conventions, and other meetings, and in the event that she cannot attend, she may send, as a substitute, an elected SWD officer, who shall have voice but no vote and vote;

Rationale: To conform to LWML Bylaw changes in 2019 and 2021.

- 6. approve payment of legitimately incurred expenses as outlined in the LWML SWD *General Guidelines* and forward to the Treasurer for payment;
- 7. be an ex-officio member of all departments and committees, except the Nominating Committee;
- 8. request the Vice President of Organizational Resources, Vice President of Gospel Outreach and Christian Life, Vice President of Special Focus Ministries and Mission Grants, or Vice President of Communication to perform duties of the office as necessary;
- 9. be responsible for the vision of the LWML SWD;
- 10. prepare a written report for each EC and BOD meeting and for the District convention manual.
- B. The Vice President of Organizational Resources shall:
 - 1. be bonded at the expense of the District LWML for an amount determined by the National LWML insurance policy;
 - 2. perform duties of the office of the President in the absence of, or at the request of the President;
 - 3. fill a temporary vacancy in the office of the President until an election is held by the BOD;
 - 4. coordinate and advise the Organizational Resources Department;
 - 5. be authorized to sign checks, in the absence of the Financial Secretary or the Treasurer;
 - 6. prepare a written report for each EC and BOD meeting and for the District convention manual.

- C. The Vice President of Gospel Outreach and Christian Life shall:
 - 1. perform the duties of the office of the President in the absence of, or at the request of, the President;
 - 2. coordinate and advise the Gospel Outreach and Christian Life Department;
 - 3. prepare a written report for each EC and BOD meeting and for the District Convention Manual.
- D. The Vice President of Special Focus Ministries and Mission Grants shall:
 - 1. perform the duties of the office of the President in the absence of, or at the request of the President;
 - 2. coordinate and advise the Special Focus Ministries and Mission Grants Department;
 - 3. prepare a written report for each EC and BOD meeting and for the District convention manual.
 - The Vice President of Communication shall:
 - 1. perform the duties of the office of the President in the absence of, or at the request of, the President;
 - 2. coordinate and advise the Communication Department;
 - 3. prepare a written report for each EC and BOD meeting and for the District convention manual.
- F. The **Recording Secretary** shall:

E.

- 1. keep minutes of the District Convention, BOD, and EC meetings;
- 2. send a copy of minutes to the LWML President and all SWD BOD members;
- 3. prepare a written report for the District convention manual and, upon request by the president, for BOD meetings.
- G. The Corresponding Secretary shall:
 - 1. act on all correspondence at the direction of the President;
 - 2. notify the EC and BOD of time and place of upcoming meetings;
 - 3. keep membership records;
 - 4. receive applications for membership;
 - 5. prepare a written report for each EC and BOD meeting and for the District convention manual.
- H. The Financial Secretary shall:
 - 1. be bonded at the expense of the District LWML for an amount determined by the National LWML insurance policy;
 - 2. receive all monies and deposit them in a financial institution approved by the EC;
 - 3. advise the treasurer of all deposits made;
 - 4. keep an itemized account of all receipts;
 - 5. prepare a financial report for the EC and BOD meetings;
 - 6. present a report at the District Convention;
 - 7. act as advisor to the Special Funds Coordinator;
 - 8. prepare a written report for each EC and BOD meeting and for the District convention manual;
 - 9. submit books for financial review at the end of each fiscal year.

I. The **Treasurer** shall:

- 1. be bonded at the expense of the District LWML for an amount determined by the National LWML insurance policy;
- 2. receive funds from the Financial Secretary through the financial institution approved by the EC;
- 3. keep an itemized account of all receipts and disbursements;
- 4. make authorized payments for expenses;
- 5. forward at least twenty-five percent (25 %) of mite box offerings monthly to the LWML office, retaining the balance for LWML SWD grants; (Article XVI, B)

Rationale: Corrected location.

- 6. prepare a report of the delegate expenses to the LWML Convention for the EC;
- 7. make payments for adopted mission grants as authorized by the President;
- 8. prepare and present financial reports for each EC and BOD meeting and the District convention;
- 9. submit books for financial review at the end of each fiscal year;
- 10. prepare the District budget and submit it to the EC for review.

ARTICLE IX – APPOINTED PERSONNEL

- A. All Appointed personnel shall:
 - 1. be appointed by the President, with the approval of the EC;
 - 2. be the Standing Committee Chairmen who serve two (2) years, or until their successors are appointed, and shall be eligible for reappointment as a voting member of the Board of Directors (BOD);
 - 3. also be Non-voting Committee Chairmen who serve two (2) years, or until their successors are appointed, and shall be eligible for reappointment as a non-voting member of the Board of Directors (BOD);

Rationale: To differentiate between voting and non-voting positions.

- 4. prepare a written report for the District Convention Manual;
- 5. perform any other duties set forth in the LWML SWD *General Guidelines Manual* for their position;

Rationale: The guidelines are found in the handbook.

- 6. attend at least one BOD meeting each biennium and attend additional BOD meetings at the request of the president, and;
- 7. prepare a written report for each BOD meeting or prepare such report at the request of the President.
- B. Appointed personnel may include, but are not limited to, the Archivist-Historian, Audio Visual, Bookstore Manager, District Convention Chairman, Crisis Management Team,

Deaf Community Liaison, Editor of the *Mission Lamp*, Facebook Administrator, Fall Retreat Chairman, Gladness Rags Coordinator, Graphic Arts Consultant, Music Coordinator, Nominating Committee, Prayer Manager (email), Parliamentarian, Public Relations Director Chairman, *Quarterly* Manager, Scholarship Chairman, Special Funds Coordinator, Transportation Chairman, Website Administrator, Winter Getaway Chairman, and TLC Fund Review Coordinator The Love of Christ Fund Committee (TLC).

Rationale: Updating list to show current appointed non-voting personnel and to conform to current titles.

ARTICLE X – BOARD OF DIRECTORS

A. The Board of Directors shall consist of the elected officers of the LWML SWD, all Zone Presidents, chairmen of the LWML SWD Standing Committees, LWML SWD Voting Appointed Personnel, and SWD Pastoral Counselors as advisory members.

Rationale: To include all members of the BOD.

B. The **Board of Directors** shall:

- 1. meet at the request of the President at least twice annually;
- 2. meet at the request of nine (9) members of the BOD;
- 3. notify the Corresponding Secretary of their alternate if unable to attend a meeting;
- 4. be responsible for reallocating mission grant funds not used within the allotted time. (Article XVII, E)

Rationale: Clarifying what needs to be done.

- C. When necessary, business may be conducted by phone, mail, or electronic messaging.
- D. Two-thirds (2/3) of the voting members shall constitute a quorum of the BOD.
- E. In the event a person holds more than one (1) voting position on the BOD, she may only vote in one (1) position. She may choose in which position she shall vote. She may send a substitute to fill the other position, and the substitute may vote.
- F. In the event of incapacity or other situation creating a vacancy in the office of the President, it shall be filled by a ballot vote of the BOD. The candidates eligible to fill the vacancy shall be one of the Vice Presidents. If there is no regular meeting of the BOD scheduled within thirty (30) days of the vacancy, the vote shall be by email ballot. The vote shall be ratified by the EC.
- G. BOD members shall perform other duties as outlined in the LWML SWD *General Guidelines Manual*.

Rationale: The guidelines are found in the handbook.

ARTICLE XI – EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

- A. The EC shall consist of the elected officers as voting members, with the Pastoral Counselors as advisory members.
- B. The EC shall meet prior to all BOD meetings and/or at the call of the President or four (4) members of the EC.
- C. Five (5) voting members shall constitute a quorum of the EC.
- D. The EC shall:
 - 1. transact business of the BOD between board meetings;
 - 2. act in an advisory capacity to the President when requested;
 - 3. fill all vacancies occurring in the elective offices, except in the office of the President;
 - 4. approve appointments made by the President;
 - 5. perform other duties as outlined set forth in the all LWML SWD *Guidelines* guidelines *Manual*.

Rationale: The guidelines are found in the handbook. Certain EC members who serve as advisors to committees also work under the guidance of the other guidelines.

ARTICLE XII – PASTORAL COUNSELORS

- A. The Pastoral Counselors shall be two (2) ordained pastors of the LCMS who are serving/retired and residing in the SWD. One (1) counselor shall be elected at each convention.
- B. Pastoral Counselors shall be advisory members of the BOD and the EC. At least one (1) of the Pastoral Counselors should attend conventions and meetings of the BOD and EC. During a four (4) year term, each Pastoral Counselor shall attend one (1) LWML Convention, preferably the Jr. Counselor if he is able.

Rationale: To clarify current practice.

C. Pastoral Counselors shall perform other duties as outlined in the LWML SWD *General Guidelines Manual*.

Rationale: The guidelines are found in the handbook.

- D. In the event of a vacancy in the office of the Pastoral Counselor, the vacancy shall be filled by the LWML SWD President from the list of previous nominees, subject to the approval of the SWD LCMS President and the following:
 - 1. Candidate's consent to serve shall be secured;
 - 2. the EC shall approve the final appointment.

ARTICLE XIII – DEPARTMENTS AND STANDING COMMITTEES

A. The departments shall be Communication, Gospel Outreach and Christian Life, Organizational Resources, Special Focus Ministries and Mission Grants, with a Vice President serving as coordinator of each department.

B. The **Department Coordinators** shall:

- 1. function as liaison between the respective committees in each department and the EC;
- 2. attend meetings of the committees in the department, in an advisory capacity, except when representing the President, at which time she shall be ex-officio;
- 3. call meetings of the department, when necessary, to plan for the development of the department;
- 4. keep the President informed of the business being transacted in the various departments;
- 5. keep zones and societies/groups informed through the District publication(s) and the LWML SWD website;

6. perform other duties as set forth in all LWML SWD *Guidelines guidelines Manual*. **Rationale: The guidelines are found in the handbook.**

C. The **Standing Committees** shall be Christian Life, Heart to Heart Sisters, Leader Development, Mission Grants, Missionary Outreach and Mission Education, Renewal, Special Focus Ministries, Structure, and the Young Woman Women's chairmen.

Rationale: To conform to current title.

- The Standing Committee Chairmen shall:
- 1. be active members of the LWML;
- 2. be appointed by the President, with the approval of the EC;
- 3. be eligible to vote on the BOD;
- 4. serve a term of two (2) years, or until their successors are appointed, and shall be eligible for one (1) reappointment;
- 5. appoint members of her committee;
- 6. keep zones and societies/groups informed of the committee's programs and resources;
- 7. prepare a written report for each BOD meeting and for the District Convention Manual.

D. The **Communication Department** may include the **Editor** of the *Mission Lamp* Editor, Facebook Administrator, Graphic Arts Consultant, E-Mail Prayer Request Manager (email), Public Relations Chairman, *Quarterly* Manager, Website Administrator, and any other committee necessary for Communication.

Rationale: To conform to current title.

E. The **Gospel Outreach and Christian Life Department** may include the Christian Life Committee, Fall Retreat Committee, Young Woman Women's Committee, Winter Getaway Committee, and any other committees necessary for Gospel Outreach and Christian Life.

Rationale: To conform to current title.

F. The **Special Focus Ministries and Mission Grants Department** may include the Deaf Community Liaison, Heart to Heart Sisters Chairman Committee, Mission Grants Committee, Missionary Outreach and Mission Education Committee, Special Focus Ministries Committee, and any other committees necessary for Special Focus Ministries and Mission Grants.

Rationale: To conform to current title.

G. The **Organizational Resources Department** may include the Archivist-Historian, Leader Development Committee, Nominating Committee, Renewal Committee, Structure Committee, and any other committees necessary for Organizational Resources.

ARTICLE XIV – DISTRICT PUBLICATION(S)

A. For the purpose of attaining closer contact, inspiration, and information regarding LWML work, the LWML SWD shall publish the *Mission Lamp*. The Editor of the *Mission Lamp* Editor shall be responsible for producing and editing this publication.

Rationale: To conform to current title.

B. A website shall be maintained to provide up to date information to members and prospective members.

ARTICLE XV – RALLIES

- A. Zone rallies shall be held twice annually (spring and fall) for mutual encouragement and inspiration and to conduct zone business. All society/group and individual members shall be encouraged to attend and may have voting privileges if zone bylaws permit.
- B. An offering shall be taken at zone rallies. If food is served, an additional freewill offering may be received to cover the cost, with any excess amount added to the rally offering. No other monetary offerings shall be gathered. Article XVI, C
- C. Rally offerings, less expenses and a twenty-five dollars (\$25) zone treasury balance, are to be sent to the District Financial Secretary to be applied to District administrative expenses.
- D. Speaker fee and mileage cost shall be paid to a speaker at a zone rally. (See LWML SWD Standing Rules)

ARTICLE XVI – FINANCES

- A. All mission funds of the LWML SWD shall be raised by freewill offerings. Contributions shall be made through Mite Boxes or any other voluntary means.
- B. Societies/Groups shall forward their Mite Box offerings to the District nancial Secretary as soon as possible after collection of the mites.

The District Treasurer shall forward at least twenty-five percent (25%) of the Mite Box offerings monthly to the LWML and retain the balance for LWML SWD grants. The BOD shall determine the percentage of mites to be sent to the LWML if greater than twenty-five percent (25%).

- C. All zone rally, prayer service, and workshop offerings, in excess of expenses and the twenty-five dollars (\$25) to be retained in the zone treasury, shall be forwarded to the District Financial Secretary for District administration expenses.
- D. Apportionment and recipients of the discretionary portions of District retreat and convention offerings shall be approved by the EC, upon recommendations from the event committees. (See LWML SWD Convention and Retreat Guidelines)
- E. Any special gifts may be apportioned by either the donor or the BOD.
- F. Excess mites gathered in each biennium shall be disbursed at the direction of the District convention delegates, considering recommendations by the EC and BOD.

ARTICLE XVII – MISSION GRANTS

- A. A mission grant is a monetary project in the interest of missions and adopted by the delegates at the District Convention.
- B. In carrying out the approved mission grants of the LWML SWD, no indebtedness shall be incurred.
- C. Selection of mission grants:
 - 1. Mission Grant proposals for consideration by the LWML SWD may be submitted by any SWD LCMS member, society/group, or zone. Suggestions shall be sent as directed on the mission grant form to the SWD Vice President of Special Focus Ministries and Mission Grants (Coordinator of the Mission Grants Department) seven (7) months prior to convention and shall be signed by the person or group submitting the proposal and counter-signed by a pastor or zone Pastoral Counselor;
 - 2. The Mission Grants committee shall study the proposals and eliminate any which are not complete or did not meet the printed deadline date;
 - 3. All proposed mission grants to group organizations within the District SWD shall be approved by the SWD LCMS President after being submitted to and reviewed by the SWD LCMS District Mission Executive;
 - 4. All proposed mission grants to group organizations outside the District SWD shall be approved by the Offices of LCMS National or International Missions;
 - 5. The EC, including the Pastoral Counselors, shall prayerfully and thoroughly review all proposals which are approved by the SWD LCMS President or the Offices of LCMS National or International Missions, eliminating any which do not meet the criteria as printed on the mission grants proposal application form;

Rationale: Items 3, 4 & 5 are conforming to LWML terminology.

- 6. The BOD, together with the Pastoral Counselors, shall study all mission grant proposals and select five (5) or more for consideration by the District convention;
- 7. Each delegate at to the District Convention shall vote, by paper or electronic ballot, for five (5) grants from the list submitted to the convention delegates by the BOD;

Rationale: To give option for use of electronic voting in the future, not just in an emergency situation.

8. There shall be no mission grants to endowment funds not established and/or administered by the LWML SWD.

D. The BOD, with input from the Vice President of Special Focus Ministries and Mission Grants, Mission Grants Committee and EC, shall establish the total grant goal for each biennium. The total dollar amount of mission grants on the ballot should be at least one and one-half times the grant total goal.

Rationale: Terminology change.

E. Mission Grant Funds:

- 1. Funds voted for a mission grant must be disbursed or put to use within a four (4) year period from the time of the vote. The BOD has authority to extend the time in case of extenuating circumstances, or to reallocate the funds;
- 2. In the event that changes in mission grant plans occur, the BOD shall be authorized to act, either in session, by mail, or by electronic messaging.

ARTICLE XVIII – FISCAL YEAR

The fiscal year of the LWML SWD shall be from July 1 to June 30 April 1 to March 31, inclusive. The financial officers shall close their books June 30 March 31.

Rationale: This will be better for officer transitions, closing of books before conventions, to be consistent with LWML, and the financial reviews would be completed before convention.

ARTICLE XIX – EMERGENCY ACTION

In the event of an emergency, such as war, epidemic, disaster, or prevailing condition which makes holding a District Convention inadvisable, the BOD shall have authority to determine whether the convention should or should not be held.

- A. A two-thirds (2/3) vote of the members of the BOD shall decide, and the vote may be taken by phone, mail, or electronic messaging;
- B. In the event the convention is not held, the BOD shall have authority to plan the procedure for conducting the routine convention business.

ARTICLE XX – PARLIAMENTARY AUTHORITY

The rules contained in the current edition of *Robert's Rules of Order Newly Revised* shall govern the proceedings of the LWML SWD in all cases to which they are applicable and in which they are not inconsistent with these bylaws, standing rules, guidelines, or Christian principles.

ARTICLE XXI – AMENDMENTS

- A. LWML SWD bylaws may be amended by a two-thirds (2/3) vote at the LWML SWD Biennial Convention, provided the proposed amendments have been presented to the delegates prior to the convention.
- B. By unanimous vote of the delegate body, a proposed amendment may be presented to a convention without previous notice. A three-fourths (3/4) vote of the delegates shall be required for adoption.
- C. Proposed amendments to the bylaws shall be submitted to the LWML SWD Structure Committee eleven (11) months prior to the date of the convention.
- D. Zone bylaws shall be in accordance with LWML and LWML SWD bylaws and shall be submitted to the LWML SWD Structure Committee for approval before adoption.

- 1. The Treasurer of the LWML SWD shall be authorized to pay travel expenses at the rate of thirty (30) cents per mile.
- 2. The honorarium for speakers at zone rallies and zone workshops shall be a minimum of twenty-five dollars (\$25), plus thirty (30) cents per mile expense.
- The LWML SWD shall have a printed guidelines *Manual* that is are maintained by the President and reviewed each biennium.
 Rationale: All guidelines are printed in the handbook.
- 4. The LWML SWD Conventions shall be held biennially in the even-numbered calendar year, between LWML Conventions, during the month of June.
- 5. Any proposed mission grant shall be removed from the ballot if, after one warning, any distribution of literature or materials is made which might influence the delegates' vote.



I performed a financial review on the Financial Secretary's books from the dates July 1, 2019, to June 30, 2020. I used the LCMS Treasurer's guide as a guideline for my review.

Using a sampling of around 15% of the deposits records and using the mites workbook pages and the mite reports monthly from the excel sheets I was given access to.

I find the Financial Secretary's books to be accurate and in good order. I do have some recommendations as follows:

Remove all copies of checks from the files.

- I assume all deposits are balanced with the Treasurer each month but, there should be a paper trail to all the deposits. There are more deposits than just mites and these may be sent via email or otherwise.
- When there are changes to previous deposits I find good back up in explaining why they were changed. This would also be good to copy a report from treasurer as to if these were switched on the treasurer side.
- One instance on June 27 of a convention donation being turned back. Make sure you have a paper trail to place it in the right category.
- The mites worksheet is most helpful but, please distinguish where each deposit is going other than mites. Divide into administration, offerings, interest, etc and be clearly marked for each category.

Thank you for the opportunity and if you have any follow up questions or areas I can explain, please feel free to contact me. Again, good work in keeping track of the South Wisconsin District finances.

<u>RE: Financial Review for periods July 1, 2018 – June 30, 2019; and July 1, 2019 – June 30, 2020</u>

I have been asked to review the financial records of the Lutheran Women's Missionary League – South Wisconsin District (or LWML-SWD). This review covered the financial periods of July 1, 2018 – June 30, 2019 and July 1, 2019 – June 30, 2020.

A financial review is different than an audit. Both provide levels of assurance that the financial statements issued by the organization are free from material misstatements as required by accounting guidance (referred to as Generally Accepted Accounting Principles, or GAAP). An audit will provide the highest level of reasonable assurance, while a financial review will provide limited assurance. In a financial review, interviews, analytics, and tests are performed. An audit increases the level of assurance by including detailed tests and evaluations of internal control systems, observing systems, and confirming balances with external parties.

The purpose of a financial review for a nonprofit is to support the treasurers in their duties, to verify the records are consistently maintained and communicated to appropriate members, and to offer comments to improve efficiencies.

To facilitate this review, I followed the financial review guidance as issued by the Lutheran Church - Missouri Synod through their Congregational Resources documentation. This guidance provided a general framework for the review. Specific steps included the following:

- Inquiry of organizational structure;
- Inquiry of controls over cash handling;
- Review of board and executive committee minutes for meetings held within the periods of review;
- Review of bank account reconciliations
- Review of the financial statements in the accounting system QuickBooks

2019-2020 Review Period Evaluation:

Through the review process, I gained an appropriate level of limited assurance that the financial statements for the 2019-2020 were free of material misstatements. A complete listing of individual findings from the detailed testing of transactions has been provided to the treasurer. These findings have been minimum and determined not to affect the decision-making ability of the Executive Committee or the Board of Directors.

Financial Review Page 2

2019-2020 Review Period Evaluation:

Through the review process, I gained an appropriate level of limited assurance that the financial statements for the June 30, 2019; and July 1, 2019 – June 30, 2020 were free of material misstatements. I noted a few checks for the selection were not properly signed, these were not material in their nature. I would encourage the organization to develop control procedures over the transfer of information and records at the end of the year. A complete listing of individual findings from the remaining accounts that were included in the detailed testing of transactions has been provided to the treasurer.

Recommendations:

I believe the Executive Committee should consider making these additional changes to improve recordkeeping and/or increase control over assets as follows:

- 1. LWML-SWD continues to reimburse volunteer travel expenses at the rate of thirty (30) cents per mile. This is consistent with the LWML national organization. According to the IRS, the standard mileage rate for charities to use for reimbursement purposes is fourteen (14) cents. This rate has remained unchanged since 2013. While it is allowable for a charity to have a policy of reimbursing volunteers at a rate higher than the IRS rate, the volunteer is required to report the difference in rates as income on their personal tax returns. I recommend that the Board of Directors recommunicate this policy to all members and committee heads, possibly directly on the reimbursement form. (per prior report)
- 2. Strive to increase automation with computer checks. Evaluate whether this can be feasible. The current QuickBooks accounting system, appear to meet the needs of the organization
- 3. Consider aligning the financial year end to March 31st to be consistent with the National LWML. This would allow for an accurate test of budget cut-off and create efficiencies in the financial review process, especially in financial review periods where the treasurer position has transitioned.

I appreciate all the work that went into making this review run so smoothly. Thank you to the women of LWML-SWD for all their charitable efforts.

Evaluation:

Through the review process, I gained an appropriate level of limited assurance that the financial statements for July 1, 2020, thru June 30, 2021, were free of material misstatements. I found that the LWML-SWD Treasurer followed the guidelines and recorded transactions promptly and consistently. All invoices/vouchers had the required two signatures, and all reimbursements accompanied with the proper accounting category.

I was impressed with the Treasurer and Financial Secretary communication, dedication and work extremely well together. They both are professional and consistent in proper handling of LWML-SWD funds.

Recommendations:

- Maintain a back up thumb drive of the financial reports for each year. Consider changing the financial statement period from June 30th to ending on March 31st. (Consistent with the National LWML) This would ease the burden
- on newly elected Treasurer and Financial Secretary and when planning the new biennium budget.
- Would love to have LWML National create a program they could roll out to the districts to have a consistence accounting system.
- Possibility of looking at an outside accounting source in the future to manage the LWML-SWD accounting.

I did a random selection from each month representing 30% of the deposits made in this period. I reviewed each receipt to the entries made in the Financial Secretary's Mite Workbook.

I find the Financial Secretary's books to be organized by date, clear notations when needed for clarification and copies of all correspondence with the Treasurer for direct deposits and reconciliation.

I only found two incorrect entries:

- 1/11/21 Deposit: An entry from Mary Martha Guild was for Quarterlies but categorized as Mites \$40
- 5/17/21 Deposit: An entry from St. Paul's Ladies Aid \$90 for Mites and \$25 for Rally was all categorized to Mites.

I could find no indication of correction and would consider these immaterial and not needing correction.

TREASURERS REPORT

LWML SWD Convention Financial Statement Comments

The financial statements that I provided are as of the end of March 2022 and represent 21 months of the 24 months covered by this biennium. The comparisons are to the prior biennium ending on June 30, 2020.

Page 1: everything about mites.

Page 2: where is the money?

Page 3: Donations/money received

Page 4: Non-designated Expenses/donated funds that could be spent as needed

Page 5: Designated Expenses/Funds donated for a specific purpose and spent for that purpose Let's look at some items:

A. LWML MITES RECEIVED: \$179,666.43 was received for mites and were allocated 25% to LWML and 75% to LWML SWD mites. That figure is shown on Page 1 at the top and on page 3 near the middle.
B. LWML MITES PAID TO LWML: \$44,916.61 (25% of \$179,666.43) was paid to LWML as shown on Page 1 near the middle and on page 5 near the top. LWML SWD will continue to pay 25% of all mites received monthly to LWML regardless of what accounting period LWML SWD selects.

C. LWML SWD MITES RECEIVED: On page 1-near the top is \$166,560.91, which is the total raised for LWML SWD mites in these 21 months. That includes our 75% plus interest, special gifts, and a \$25,000 grant from a prior biennium which was returned as it could not be used timely for the purpose for which it was requested.

D. LWML SWD GRANTS PAID: On page 1 at the bottom and also near the middle you will see that \$141,500 was paid for SWD grants selected in June of 2020. Although \$153,750 (75% of the mite goal of \$205,000) were selected for payment, 2 recipients withdrew their grant before payment as they could not use the requested funds per their grant request. The partially funded last grant was fully funded as the funds were available due to the withdrawn grants. On page 5 at the top is that \$141,500 which was paid for those grants.

E. FEMALE CHURCH WORKER SCHOLARSHIPS: On page 2, there is \$81,274.14 in all of the scholarship accounts. We were blessed to have received a special bequest of \$25,000 (see the middle of page 3 for that donation.) this biennium which was used to increase the frozen base from \$50,000 to \$75,000. That base earns interest for scholarships. Income also comes from special gifts and 25% of fall retreats and winter getaway events.

F. LWML SWD TLC (THE LOVE OF CHRIST): The Love of Christ Fund was set up with \$25,000 to provide monies for SWD LWM administrative expenses when additional funds are needed to meet emergency needs of congregations, or emergency financial assistance for our SWD missionaries, and to give financial assistance to those wishing to attend SWD conventions and retreats who might not otherwise be able to afford to attend. Income comes from 25% of convention offerings, special contributions and interest. Currently there is \$75,573.34 in those TLC accounts as shown on the middle of page

G. 2023 CONVENTION DONATIONS: \$7000 was requested for LWML SWD to donate to the 2023 convention start-up costs as a hosting district. We received \$3567.14 in donations and interest as shown on page 2-line 3. So we are \$3432.86 short of funding that amount that we have already paid (see page 2-near the bottom). We will continue to accept donations for those costs, and hope to not take those funds out of our available administrative funds.

LWML Young Women Event – "Day of Relaxation and Fun for the Whole Family" Verse "...my hope is in You all day long." Psalms 25:5. Servant Events: Lap blankets for local nursing home residents, Cards/bookmarks coloring for local nursing home residents, and witness bracelets for MOST ministries. The Event was to be held at Trinity Lutheran in Wisconsin Dells on August 14, 2021 but was canceled due to lack of response/interest.

2021 SWD Fall Retreat – The SWD Fall Retreat was held on September 17 &18 in Oshkosh at the Best Western Premier Waterfront Hotel and Convention Center. Theme: "Jesus is the Light" based on John 9:5 "As long as I am in the world, I am the light of the world." Speaker Deaconess Sandra Rhein shared her experiences of her missionary work as a sacred music educator. Deaconess Katherine Rittner spoke about the Clothing and Food Co-op at Concordia Theological Seminary, Fort Wayne. Pastor Barkley led the Bible Study on "Jesus is the Light". Retreat attendance totaled 112. Offerings included \$1,302.75 to deaconess training in Latin America and \$434.25 to the Female Church Worker Scholarship fund. Mites totaled \$641.79. Twenty-five large boxes of items were collected for our Gifts from the Heart recipient, the Lutheran Food Pantry in Oshkosh. Servant Events: 43 tied fleece hats were made to be given to area parochial school students. Around 500 crosses were made from greeting cards with John 3:16 written on the back to be given to missionaries.105 Blessing bags were made up for the homeless and the Milwaukee Urban Ministry to distribute.

Fall Rallies – all 21 Zones held Fall Rallies.

Hannah Eatherton is attending Concordia University, Seward to study elementary education. Lily Ficken will study elementary education with an emphasis on Early Childhood Education or Classical Ed.

LWML SWD Winter Getaway Retreat – February 4 & 5, 2022, at Clarion Hotel and Conference Center (formerly Wintergreen Hotel) in Wisconsin Dells. The theme: "The Joy in Christ's Mission!" based on Philippians 4:4, "Rejoice in the Lord always; again I will say, rejoice." Rev. Matthew Gehrke led the Bible Study/Devotion on "Rejoice in the Lord Always" 2 Corinthians 11:23-30. Rev. Keffie Deen II showed the movie "Coco" in presenting Faith in Film. Rev. Ryan and Emily McDermott spoke about their work in Deaf Ministry in Madison, WI. Rev. Nathan Meador, SWD Mission Executive, asked us to pray for 40 days in Lent for the city of Milwaukee and reminded us that we were designed for community. Joanna Ellis invited us to attend the Heart to Heart, *Sisters of All Nations* Event to be held at St. Peter-Immanuel Lutheran Church on Saturday, March 19, 2022. The theme will be "Declare His Glory Amongst the Nations" based on I Chronicles 16:23-24. There will be no 2023 Winter Getaway so that all energies can be focused on preparations for the LWML convention to be held in Milwaukee.

2022 Prayer Service – This Prayer Service was written by Rev. Robert W. Grimm and is available on the LWML website. Theme: "Lord, Teach us to Pray", Luke 11:1. I was elected to the position of Treasurer by mail as Covid kept us from having an in-person convention in June of 2020. The previous treasurer Kris Hebel did transition with me in late July of 2020, as she was trying to get all of the expenses and refunds from the June 2020 convention into the accounting records as of the June 30, 2020 biennium. Although Kris provided a nice set of directions and the QuickBooks non-profit edition accounting software, it was rather overwhelming starting the new biennium and statements on my own.

As part of my learning how things were done, and how they should be done in the future, I worked with the reviewer of the July 1, 2019 – June 30, 2020 treasurer's records. Another person reviewed my first year of treasurer's reports for July 1, 2020 – June 30, 2021. Both of these reviewers (as well as the reviewers of the previous 4+ years) recommended that LWML SWD adopt a fiscal year ending March 31st to be consistent with the national LWML. That fiscal year change would make final financials available at the LWML SWD convention, so that we would know at convention if we had an overage or a shortage of mites and could make better decisions for the new mite goals and biennium budget. It would also enable the review to be done prior to the convention and enable a newly elected treasurer to continue the reports for the next month without waiting for records from the convention expenses.

We continued using the Bill Pay system through the bank, whereby the bank issues checks and mails them directly, which saves time and money on check stock, postage, and envelopes. Previously we had a separate treasurer for Fall Retreat and for Winter Getaway, but I took on that duty for the 2021 Fall Retreat and 2022 Winter Getaway.


Structure Committee Chair
